Things you need to know about the Ox Roast

The following are a few basics about the DeWitt Ox Roast - answers to some of the most asked questions and some tips about getting around DeWitt. Hopefully, this will assist you in enjoying a safe, fun filled festival day.

Parking information

Parking is available on the outskirts of town on city streets. Golf carts are available throughout the downtown area for people who need help getting around.

Rest areas

Restrooms are available in several locations: downtown, at city park near the river, and on side streets.

First aid/police

A first-aid station and police assistance booth is located between Sam's Diner and Terranova's Party Store on Bridge Street.

Camping sites

Sleepy Hollow State Park, located at 7835 E. Price Road, Laingsburg, welcomes visitors with 181 modern campground sites, each equipped with electrical outlets, picnic tables and a fire circle. Two shower facilities are available.

The park is open 8 a.m.-10 p.m. each day, with the campground open 24 hours. There is a \$10 per night camping fee, and all motor vehicles must have a \$4 sticker pass (available at the park). For more information, call (517) 651-6217.

Restrictions

No motor vehicles (cars, motorbikes, recreational vehicles, etc) will be allowed on the streets of the immediate downtown. Surrounding streets are open and usable for parking. Also, no alcohol is allowed on city streets during the Ox Roast.

Ox Roast continues to evolve after 50 years

First Ox Roast's goal was to raise funds for a community building

For a child growing up in DeWitt in years past, the annual Ox Roast (the correct DeWitt pronunciation is "Oxt Rhose") was anticipated as the pinnacle event of the year, rating right up there with Christmas and the last day of school.

Allowances were saved, pop bottles cashed-in and chores were done for that extra spending money needed to last us through the day. Weeks ahead of time, preparations were made to festoon bicycles with crepe paper and intricate plans were hammered out as to who we would meet where and when and what ride to go on first. It was exhausting work for us kids, but little did we realize at the time all the exhausted adults that had been planning the event for months.

DeWitt's first Ox Roast in 1945 was a simple affair compared to what we've come to expect. But it was put on by the community for the community with one objective: to raise funds for a community building on Washington Street which would serve as a memorial to the recent veterans of World War II. A simple plan, with simple means, with a simple goal.

The Ox Roast of 1945 was held up on the main four corners as a one day affair. There were no commercial concessions that year and all the food and prizes were donated. The rides and games were made locally by volunteers and even the ox was donated by the Rosevale Packing Company.

"A lot of work!" recalls Bertha Lenneman, one of the organizers of that first event. "But everyone pulled together and worked so hard...and every dime went in toward the building." Bertha admitted that no one really knew how to plan the event, they just put it together the best they could and learned from their mistakes.

With experience under their belts and new ideas the organizers later tried holding the event at the school grounds on Washington Street but it was decided to return it to the four corners where it would basically remain up to the present. They also tried having a two-day affair but it was deemed too much work and, as many of the local support groups were based in the area churches, there was opposition to using Sunday.

One feature of the first Ox Roast which has continued to the present is the raffle. The first year it consisted mainly of items donated by local merchants. Within a few years however, the pot was sweetened with the grand prize being an automobile; a tradition which lasted several decades. By the 1950's the commercial rides had become an annual thing but many of the games remained locally made by various organizations. It was a format which continued into the 1970's.

As much fun as the Ox Roast was, the anticipation is what many people recall the most. It's hard to describe the excitement that arose in the community in preparation for the event; I can't think of a modern equivalent. It seems DeWitt (or perhaps communities in general) so seldom get excited in unison anymore. Weeks before the big day, service club members went

door-to-door selling raffle tickets. Women's groups went door-to-door also, recruiting volunteer bakers for pies and brownies. Organizers often called every number in the phone book canvassing households for volunteers, filling endless sheets of work schedules.

For the children, the closing of the streets on Friday afternoon began the countdown. And throughout the night, with the sound of the carnival workers hammering everything together, kids spent a restless night with visions of the Tilt-A-Whirl and Miss Frolic spinning in their heads.

Although the dynamics have changed somewhat, the DeWitt Ox Roast remains basically the same: an event of simple pleasures put on by the community, for the community to be enjoyed by everyone. May it continue to arouse community unity for another 50 years.

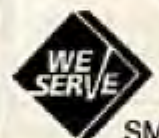

Annual parade kicks off at 10 a.m. downtown

With flashing lights and sirens blaring, DeWitt Police Chief Wendell Myers will escort a line of more than 60 entries in the 50th Annual DeWitt Ox Roast Parade, Aug. 19.

The parade starts at 10 a.m. on west Main Street and will travel through the downtown area, turning on Bridge Street and then west on Washington Street past the DeWitt Memorial Building. A viewing stand is located on the corner of Washington and Bridge Street.

The rain put a damper on last year's hour-long event. "We're hoping for better weather this year," says Parade Chairman Rev. Michael Arnold. "If it's good weather, it will probably last a little longer than an hour."

In celebration of the Ox Roast's 50th year, the theme of the event is "Working 50 Years Together 1946-1995". It will feature many of DeWitt's past mayors and presidents of the Memorial Association.

New this year are a group from St. Johns with miniature horses and a monster truck from the DeWitt area. "We're also having a bag pipe band," Arnold says.

In addition, there will be several marching units, floats and antique vehicles. Local officials, including Mayor Mike Towns will join the parade with Citizen of the Year Dick Smeage and pageant winners.

Senator Mike Rogers and Representative Allen Cropsey will also be on hand, as well as many civic groups, churches, clubs and school bands.

radio station, will be judged in four different categories, offering a \$25 prize for best of show in each: Best Marching Unit (style, presentation, size), Best Non-Commercial Float (theme presentation), Best Animal Unit and Best Antique Show Vehicle (25 years of older).

Handling the judging duties are Patty Weihe of Ft. Wayne, Indiana, who is the past director of the W.T.A. National Champion Vetterettes drum and drill team; Rev. Milan Maybee of Jackson, who is an antique car and truck enthusiast and auctioneer; and Jody Knol of East Lansing's WKAR FM-90's Morning Classical show.
