Qualifications for Entrance

Students may enter the High School upon the presentation of a Commissioner's Diploma, showing promotion card from eighth grade of another High School, or passing a satisfactory examination.

Non-Resident

The DeWitt Union Schools are maintained for the benefit of those who reside in District No. 6, yet we offer advantages to non-resident students who are seeking an education and would be pleased to welcome such to our school. Tuition very low in price—25c per week.

Non-resident pupils will be required before entering their classes, on the first day of their second weeks' attendance, in each term to present to their teacher or the principal, their tuition bill receipted by the Assessor of the District.

Classification

All classification of pupils upon entering the schools shall be made by the Principal and all pupils are at any time subject to re-classification, if in his judgment it is advisable.

Order and first-class discipline are maintained at all times and the individual student is protected while in attendance.

Promptness

at all times is urged. Tardiness, open disobedience, insubordination or the use of profane or improper language or the use of tobacco in any form during school hours is strictly forbidden.

Diplomas

are given to all who complete the High School course. This Diploma will admit holder to 11th grade Lansing High School.

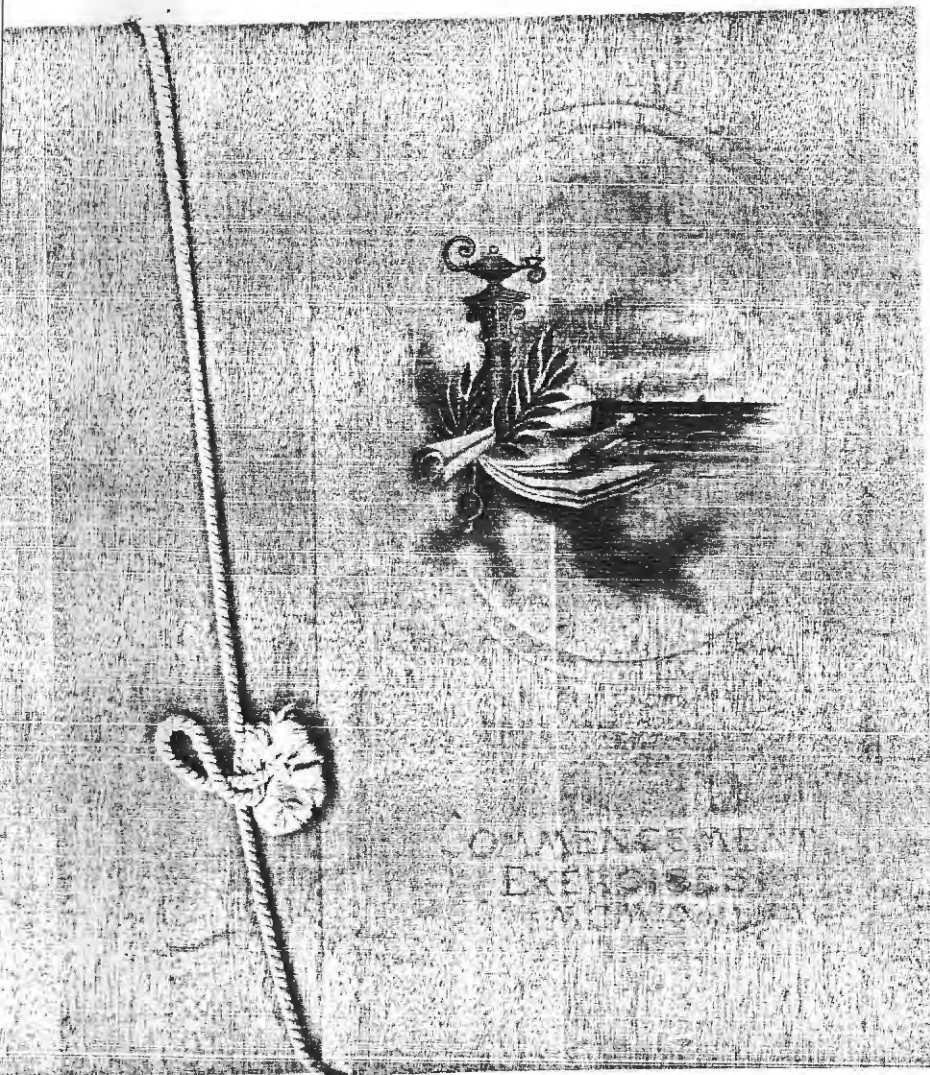
