Class reunion

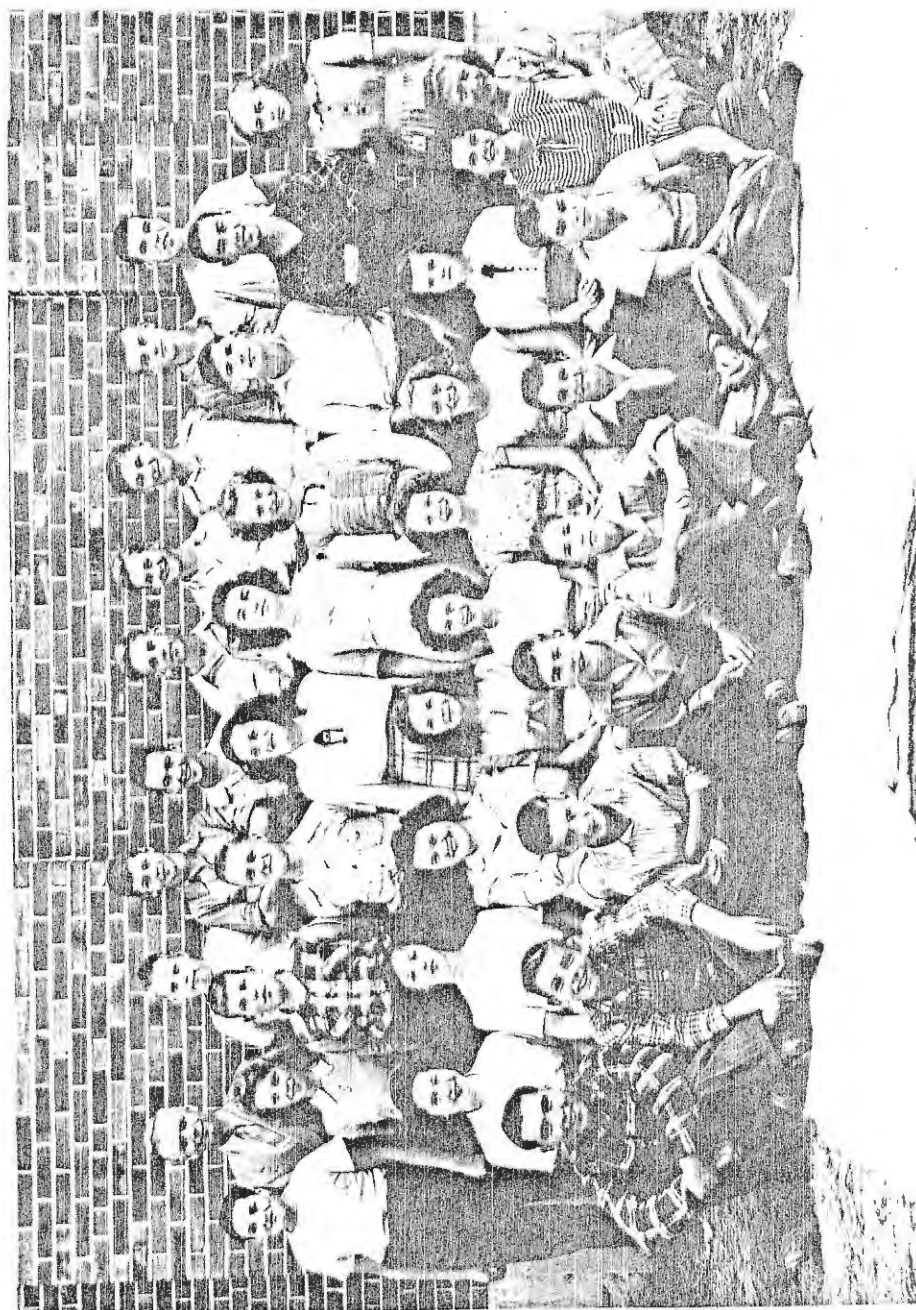
