THE FIRST TOWNSHIP IN CLINTON COUNTY TO BE GIVEN ORGANIZATION WAS THAT OF DEWITT. The act of the Legislature, approved March 23, 1836, provided that the County of Clinton "be and the same hereby is, set apart and organized into a separate township by the name of DeWitt, and the first township meeting there- after shall be held at the dwelling house of David Scott in said township." David Scott had come to this area with his family in October 1833.

In 1837 the township of DeWitt as then existing, was divided along the line of the center, and a new township was organized on the west one half and called Watertown, and the first township meeting was held in the house of John Niles in said township.

The next subdivision occurred in 1838 when the east half of Watertown was set apart and called Wandaugon and the first meeting was held at the home of John Campau. People dissatisfied with the Indian name later changed it to Lebanon.

At the time the County of Clinton received its organization in 1839 there were but three townships. DeWitt comprised the eastern half, Watertown comprised the present township and what is now Westphalia and Riley townships, and Wandaugon comprised the west.

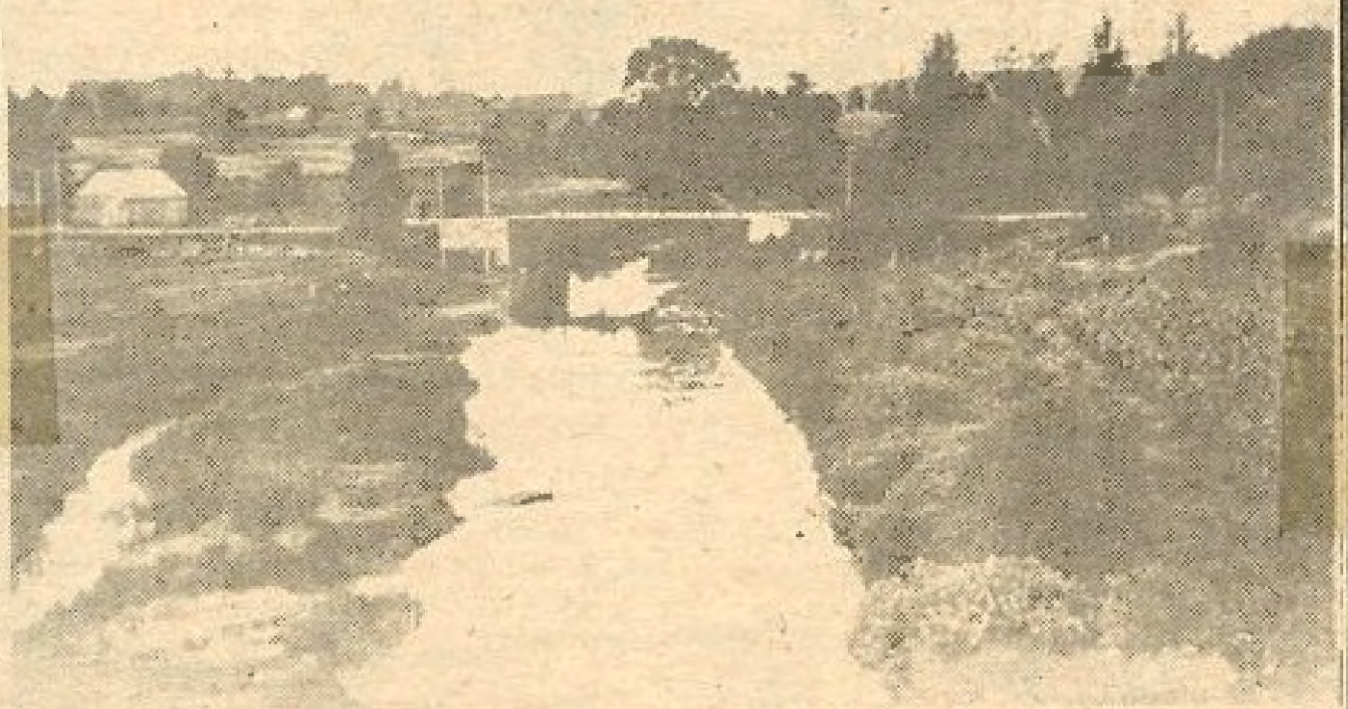
