



A LIKING FOR children, capability to learn about a particular project and study to "keep ahead of the 4-H'ers," physically able to keep up with the youngsters and able to present formal education in an informal way — creating a desire to learn.

Mrs Anabel Peck of Elsie, Russell Howe of Eagle and Mrs Goldie Moore of DeWitt were chosen as outstanding Clinton county 4-H leaders of this year to attend the third all-state 4-H Leader-Meet in East Lansing.

THEY WERE chosen on the basis of service to 4-H through activities offered, instruction and member participation in county projects.

Mrs Peck has been a 4-H leader for 11 years and started the "Page 4-Corners" group, which now has 22 members. She has interested and helped instruct the members in photography, gardening, bird study, cooking and sewing.

Russell Howe's 4-H group, the 12 "Eagle Scramblers," work with poultry and live-stock, often meeting at the Howe's turkey farm in Eagle.

A LEADER for five years, Howe also has encouraged his three daughters to participate in 4-H. All three are state project winners this year. Lois, 16, and Marguerite, 14, will give a demonstration at the state show in Lansing on ways to cook a turkey and home improvement, respectively.

Alice Howe, 12, has given her demonstration on home safety at the district meeting at MSU.

MRS GOLDIE Moore is one of "Olive's 4-H Projects" group leaders which has 40 members. In project work she devotes much of her time to vegetable and flower gardening, food preparation and preservation, photography, clothing, knitting and home improvement instruction to 17 girls.

THE TWO longest 4-H leader service records in the county belong to Mrs. Nora Hitchcock of DeWitt and Ed Rose from Eagle. Both have led 4-H groups for over 25 years.

Mrs. Hitchcock, 71, now serves on the 4-H advisory council and was a counselor at 4-H summer camp this year.

Rose continues his 4-H work with the "Eagle Termites" in poultry, calf and electrical projects.

MRS HITCHCOCK will have 28 girls exhibiting at the fair this year. Last year there were 35. Down through the years, she has instructed 158 girls and one boy.

She is teaching sewing to many girls whose mothers were members of Mrs. Hitchcock's groups in the last 25 years.

A seamstress for over a half a century, Mrs. Hitchcock is looking for new fields. She plans to take a course in tailoring.

SHE WAS invited into 4-H work by Roscoe Smith, former Clinton county 4-H leader, when some DeWitt girls wanted to organize a club but had no leader. She has been busy in 4-H ever since with the exception of one season.

The first club, "The Happy Four," with Evelyn Boss, Violet Miller, Jean Bedaine and Gail Smith (who later became a home demonstration agent), was organized.

The second year the name had to be changed to "Jolly Rippers", because of increased membership. They met on Saturdays, usually for an all-day session, which often included a potluck dinner. Now the meetings are held on Mondays in the DeWitt Memorial building.

IN 1938 WHEN the Clinton County 4-H Service Club was organized, Mrs. Hitchcock be-

came a charter member.

She attended Club Week in 1938 and again in 1942, when she became a member of the State Service Club.

Mrs. Hitchcock went on the Canadian trip in 1939, 1953 and 1957; once as an award, once as chaperone and once as a last minute recruit in place of Mrs. Smith, who was unable to go because of an illness in her home.

SHE IS AT present serving on the 4-H Advisory Council; has been a willing worker at the 4-H Fair, and has served as cook, counselor and teacher at 4-H summer camp. She has also helped make it possible for less fortunate children to attend a session at camp.

Mrs. Hitchcock has been active in summer club work and has acted as judge in other counties as well as in Clinton.

Her annual Christmas party started with a "corn husking bee" at the Hitchcock farm years ago. In return for husking their corn, Mrs. Hitchcock and her late husband entertained the huskers at a turkey dinner during the Christmas vacation, when those who were in college would be able to attend. The "Husking Bee" is a thing of the past, but the Christmas parties continue.


