Mr. Miller is widely known as a thresherman and for the past several years has been Clinton county probation officer.

Egbert Miller, son of Mr. and Mrs. Elisha Miller, was born in Lenawee county 79 years ago. Mr. Miller was stricken with a severe heart attack on the streets of Lansing, Thursday afternoon, Nov. 6, 1930, and died suddenly.

He also leaves one sister, Mrs. Jennie Hamilton of Riley, three brothers, Isaac of Ovid, Lewis of Fenton and Charles of St. Johns, and 5 grandchildren. One sister, Mrs. Enola Hamer, passed away in 1920. The funeral was held from the Jarvis-Estes home Saturday and burial made in Mt. Rest, St. Johns.

RESIDENT OF OLIVE TOWNSHIP PASSES


STROKE PROVES FATAL TO

He is the son of **Greg Molzon** and **Rayla Molzon** of DeWitt.


Ray began his Scouting career as a Cub Scout in 1986 and has earned the required merit badges.

Age 82, died July 27, 1997. Born January 17, 1915 in Bingham Township, Mr. Moore worked as a Farmer all his life. He was a member of Hope Lutheran Church in DeWitt and the Farm Bureau. SERIOUS INJURY.—On Wednesday last while William Morgan, a man about 23 years old, living in the east part of the township of DeWitt, was working in a saw-mill, an old iron dog, used to hold logs on the carriage, broke, flew on to the circular saw, and was hurled from thence like a shot, and the piece, which weighed about $2\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, struck Morgan just above the right eye, crushing the frontal bone. Dr. R. J. Shank, accompanied by Dr. McMillan of this city attended the wounded man, and removed the entire right orbital arch from the articulation of the nasal bone to the temporal bone, which was depressed and had to be elevated. The bone removed was crushed into small pieces, and there was left a cavity in the skull about two by three inches in area. Notwithstanding his terrible injury the patient rallied from the shock, and on Thursday his mind was clear and he was quite comfortable. His recovery would be little short of miraculous.—
