**Ray Molzon** has received the highest award in Boy Scouting — the Eagle Award.

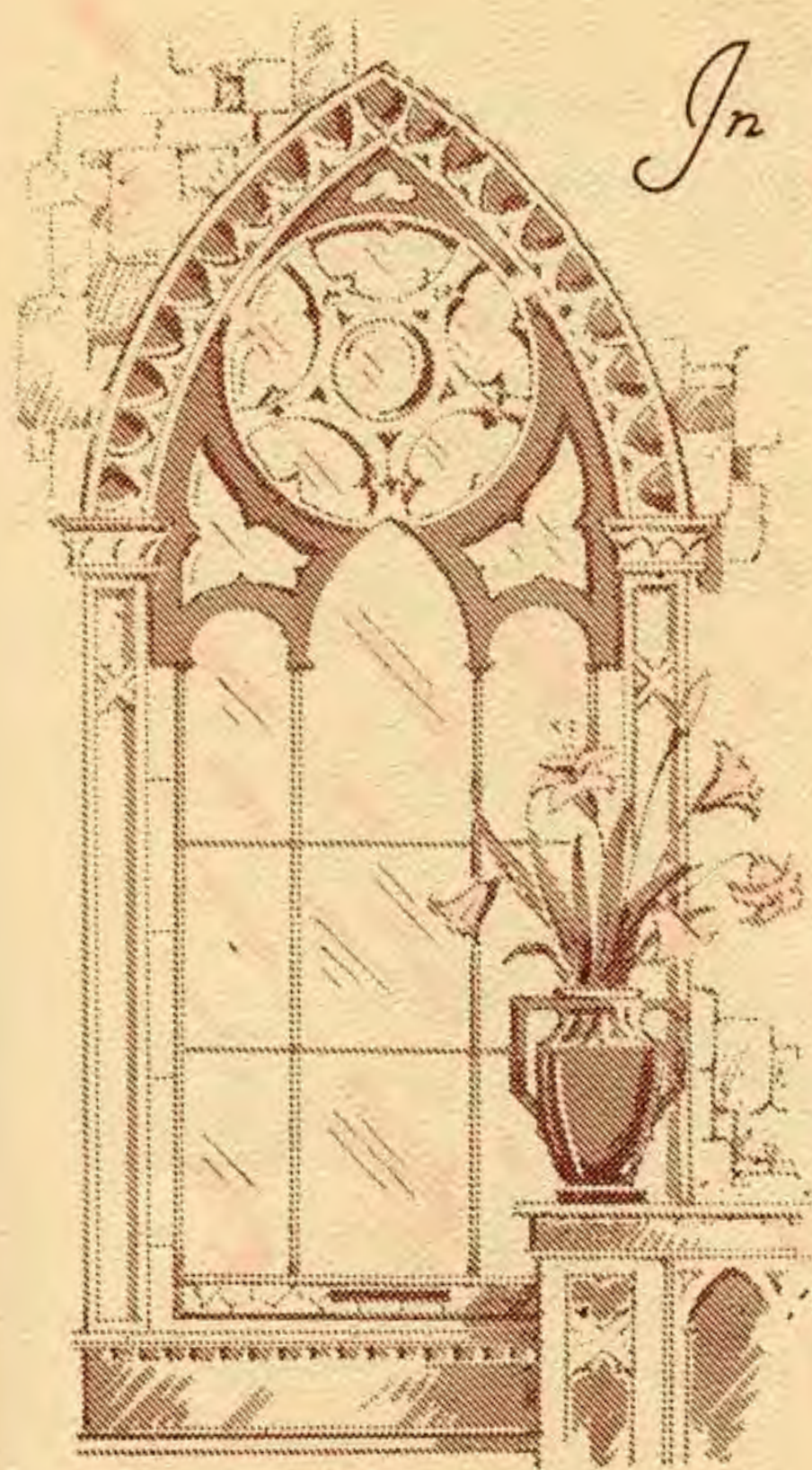
He is the son of **Greg Molzon** and **Rayla Molzon** of DeWitt.

## **MOORE, RAYMOND, J.**

### **DeWitt**

**SERIOUS INJURY.**—On Wednesday last while William Morgan, a man about 23 years old, living in the east part of the township of DeWitt, was working in a saw-mill, an old iron dog, used to hold logs on the carriage, broke, flew on to the circular saw, and was hurled from thence like a shot, and the piece, which weighed about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  pounds, struck Morgan just above the right eye, crushing the frontal bone. Dr. R. J. Shank, accompanied by Dr. McMillan of this city attended the wounded man, and removed the entire right orbital arch from the articulation of the nasal bone to the temporal bone, which was depressed and had to be elevated. The bone removed was crushed into small pieces, and there was left a cavity in the skull about two by three inches in area. Notwithstanding his terrible injury the patient rallied from the shock, and on Thursday his mind was clear and he was quite comfortable. His recovery would be little short of miraculous.—Lansing Republican, Feb. 25.
