Leona Taylor, 101, stayed healthy to end

DEWITT — Leona Taylor, 315 Hickory St., who lived 101 years within four miles of where she was born, died Thursday.

A life-long member of the Sunshine Club, she remained an alert, good-humored woman until her death.

During an interview to mark her 100th birthday last year, she

talked about her daily walks out to the road in front of her house.

"It's not very far," she said, "but it keeps me from sitting down all the time. There ain't many who live to be 100 and still have their health. I'm so happy I'm not bedridden."

Asked if she had a recipe for

longevity, Leona said, "Just hard work; hard work never killed anybody."

Taylor had nine grandchildren, 28 great-grandchildren and five great, great-grandchildren.

She will be buried Saturday morning at the DeWitt Cemetery.



MRS. TURNER, PIONEER, HERE, IS DEAD AT 86

The funeral of Mrs. Eliza Turner, who died Monday, will be held at the home, 226 West Madison st., Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be made in Mt. Hope cemetery.

Eliza Monroe Turner was born at Amherst, N. Y., March 18, 1832, and was 86 years of age at the time of her death. She came to Michigan in 1836, settling at Eagle, Clinton county. She came to Lansing with her sister in 1843 and was married to Dr. Charles Turner in 1855, and had lived in Lansing almost constantly since that time. She was a charter member of the Franklin Avenue Presbyterian church.

Mrs. Turner was always active in various activities of the city. In the days of the northern Michigan forest fires she had charge of the relief work in this city. She was well known to the early residents of Ingham, Clinton and Gratiot counties.

She is survived by two brothers, William J. Monroe of Lansing, and Horace P. Monroe of LaMesa, Colo., two sons, Howard E. and H. Wesley Turner, and one grandson, Robert Lee Turner.
