George O. Vaughan, 67, succumbed to a sudden heart attack Tuesday morning, March 17, at his home, 406 South Clinton avenue, while convalescing from a fractured leg. Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p. m. Friday at the Osgood funeral home with burial in Mt. Rest cemetery.

Mr. Vaughan broke his leg Jan. 17 while employed by R. E. Benson. He was taken to Clinton Memorial hospital where he remained until he was able to return to his home on March 4. He observed his 67th birthday last week.

George O. Vaughan was born on March 11, 1869, to John and Carrie Vaughan near Ithaca. Practically all of his life was spent in or near St. Johns and Lansing. For the past five years he had been employed by the Clinton County Road Commission.

On May 18, 1901, he was married to Miss Bertha DeWitt of St. Johns. To this union were born nine children, eight of whom, with the widow, survive. 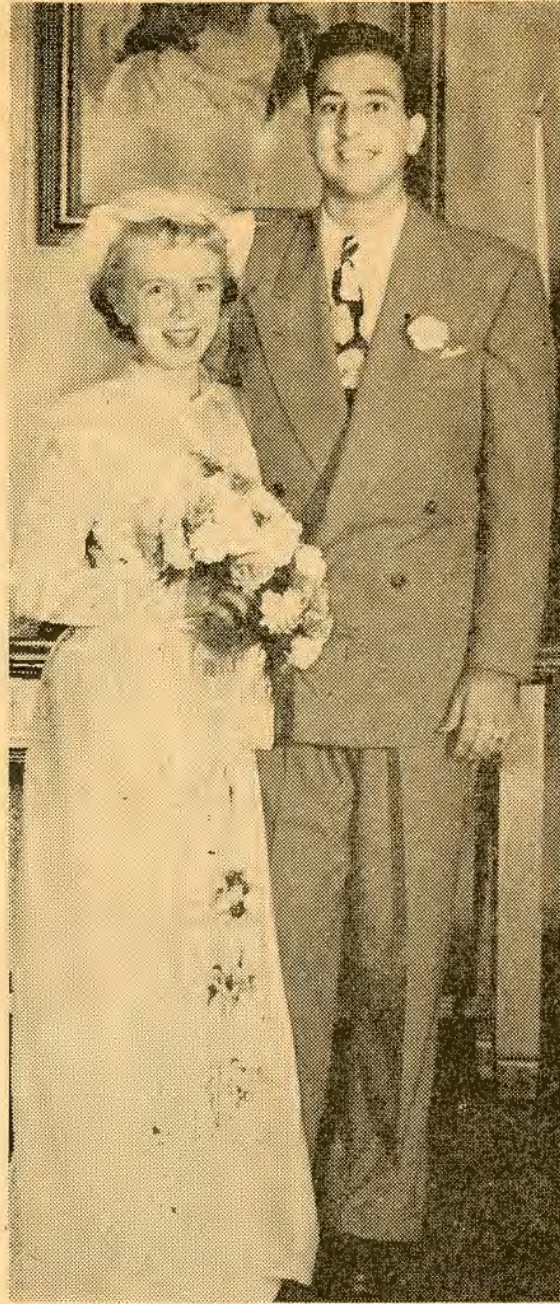
## **VETTRAINO, EUGENE A.**
