

Sour Milk Chocolate Cake

1/2 cup butter	* to make sour milk:
2 cups granulated sugar	1 cup milk
2 eggs	3 tbsps. vinegar
3 cups cake flour	mix and let set for
1 1/2 tbsps. baking powder	1 hour or until curdled
*1 cup sour milk	
1/2 cup cocoa	or unsweetened baking
1 cup boiling water	chocolate (5 squares,
2 tbsps. baking soda	1 oz. each)

Cream sugar and shortening. Add eggs. Sift flour 3 times and add baking powder. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture alternating with sour milk. Mix cocoa (or the baking chocolate, melted over low heat) and baking soda. Add boiling water. Combine both mixtures. Bake for 45 minutes at 350° F. in two 8 or 9 inch greased and floured cake pans. (25° less for glass pans) Frost with traditional buttercream icing.

RIBBING

Cast on 80(90-100) sts loosely. Work in K1, P1 ribbing for 1(1½-2)".

BODY

Rows 1-6: * K5, P5; repeat from * across. Rows 7-12: * P5, K5; repeat from * across. Rows 13-30: Repeat Rows 1-12 once (Checkerboard Pattern), then repeat Rows 1-6 once more.

TOP SHAPING

Row 1: * K8, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 72(81-90) sts.

Row 2 and all WRONG side rows: Purl across. Row 3: * K7, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 64(72-80) sts.

Row 5: * K6, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 56(63-70) sts.

Row 7: * K5, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 48(54-60) sts.

Row 9: * K4, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 40(45-50) sts.

Row 11: * K3, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 32(36-40) sts.

Row 13: * K2, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 24(27-30) sts.

Row 15: KO(1-0), K2 tog across: 12(14-15) sts. Cut yarn leaving a 12" end. Thread yarn needle with end and weave through remaining sts, pulling firmly to close; sew seam.

Add pom-pom.

Worsted Weight Yarn: 1 skein

Straight knitting needles, size 8(5.00 mm) or

GAUGE: In Checkerboard Pattern, 10 sts = 2"

Rows 1-6: * K5, P5; repeat from * across.
Rows 7-12: * P5, K5; repeat from * across.
Rows 13-30: Repeat Rows 1-12 once (Checkerboard Pattern), then repeat Rows 1-6 once more.

TOP SHAPING

Row 1: * K8, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 72(81-90) sts.

Row 2 and all WRONG side rows: Purl across.

Row 3: * K7, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 64(72-80) sts.

Row 5: * K6, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 56(63-70) sts.

Row 7: * K5, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 48(54-60) sts.

Row 9: * K4, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 40(45-50) sts.

Row 11: * K3, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 32(36-40) sts.

Row 13: * K2, K2 tog; repeat from * across: 24(27-30) sts.

Row 15: KO(1-0), K2 tog across: 12(14-15) sts. Cut yarn leaving a 12" end. Thread yarn needle with end and weave through remaining sts, pulling firmly to close; sew seam.

Add pom-pom.
